

(IMMIGRATION) FORMALITIES

Upon arrival you will need to register at the municipality you are planning to settle in and here you will also receive your BSN. You can find details about the BSN (Burger Service Nummer/ social security number) and other formalities in the links below. Depending on your nationality, you might need a residence- and work permit to stay in the Netherlands. Also, for cross border workers permits might be needed. CHECKLIST

Moving to another country can be an overwhelming experience and proper organization is necessary to make it a smooth process. Here is a basic checklist to help you, once you've arrived in the Netherlands. More detailed information about all the topics can be found on the websites mentioned in this folder.

ONCE YOU'VE ARRIVED

- Register with the local municipality where you are going to live and apply for a BSN (social security number).
- ☐ Collect your residence documents.
- ☐ Find long-term accommodation.
- ☐ Get connected: arrange telecom, internet and utilities.
- ☐ Open a bank account.
- ☐ Apply for Dutch health insurance.

WHEN SETTLING IN

- ☐ Apply for a DigiD to access governmental sites: <u>digid.nl</u>
- ☐ Apply for benefits when applicable: <u>toeslagen.nl</u>
- ☐ Register with a local dentist and family doctor (general practitioner).
- ☐ Investigate schooling/childcare possibilities in the region.
- ☐ Obtain a driver's licence or exchange your current licence: <u>rdw.nl</u>
- ☐ Buy a bicycle.
- ☐ Investigate possibilities for applying for 30% tax ruling.
- $\hfill \square$ Join the international community and/or make use of the buddy program.
- ☐ Learn the local language.
